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



#### **Director's Note**

On the surface, *Erma Bombeck: At Wit's End* is a short biography of a life and career, presented by sisters Margaret and Allison Engel using Mrs. Bombeck's trademark sarcastic but insightful sense of humour.

As a biography, the play explores themes of life in suburbia, motherhood, the role of women in mid-20th century America, and balancing the responsibilities of a wife and mother with the desire for something of one's own.

But I doubt you came here tonight to see an exploration of themes. More likely, you're here just to be entertained or because you're lucky enough to remember Erma Bombeck's columns and books. They certainly resonated with my mother, an "ordinary housewife", who used to quote them to me. Her experiences were the same as Erma's and, it turned out, the same as those of millions of other women.

The themes in the play develop in that same way, I think. They start from the everyday, outwardly ordinary experiences of one woman and build into something big, important, and quite often beautiful.

I hope you enjoy the result of all the hard work that has gone into this production.

# Meet the Woman Who Made the World Laugh....

Erma Louise Fiste was born on February 21, 1927. With her parents and half-sister Thelma, Erma lived in a Dayton, Ohio neighborhood filled with hardworking, lower middle class families.

At fifteen, Erma walked into the Dayton Herald and said, "I want to work for your paper." Bill Bombeck worked for the city's morning paper, the Dayton Journal. Sparks flew. After only a couple of dates, he left for the Army and Korea, but when he returned the two - both age twenty-two - got married.

Erma went to college and worked as a columnist, mostly in to the women's section. World War II had created a profound change for American women. With their men at war, millions of women flooded the workplace. Erma's first columns struck a nerve with these women.

When Erma adopted daughter Betsy, she said goodbye to her career without the slightest doubt. Sons Andrew and Matthew followed, but the demands of motherhood amazed Erma. Since no one discussed these feelings in public, Erma thought that she was the only woman in the world experiencing them.



One day in 1964, Erma walked into the office of the editor of the local paper and said, "I'd like to do a column for you." Her popularity grew, and the column eventual appeared in 900 papers. Book deals soon followed, then magazine columns, a regular feature on Good Morning America, and television and movie deals.

Erma was never political, but in the 70s the fight for the Equal Rights Amendment forced her into the arena. It surprised a lot of people when the "voice of the American housewife" came out in support of the ERA. Her support of the amendment did not include its feminist leaders, whom she felt were waging a war using housewives as the battleground.

When asked by a reporter why she poured so much time and effort into the ERA, Erma replied, "I'm doing it for my kids. It will be important to them. It's also a great feeling to be a part of history." The failure of the ERA was one of the biggest disappointments of her life.

Erma survived breast cancer and a mastectomy but kept secret the fact that she had kidney disease, until 1993.On April 3, 1996, she received a kidney transplant. She died on April 22, 1996, aged 69, from complications of a kidney transplant.



At her funeral, friend Phil Donahue eulogized, "She was real and she brought us down to earth — gently, generously and with brilliant humor. When the scholars gather hundreds of years from now to learn about us, they can't know it all if they don't read Erma."
