

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




Arguably his most popular story, Charles Dickens' novella, *A Christmas Carol. In Prose. Being a Ghost Story of Christmas*, commonly known as *A Christmas Carol*, was published 179 years ago. It has never been out of print since and has proven to be as timeless as the Christmas story itself. The themes of poverty, charity, transformation, and redemption are universal and especially amplified in the settings, plots, and characters that Dickens created.

Dickens reportedly said that his story was best listened to in a darkened room, and he did public readings of it himself. For its first 100 years, most audiences enjoyed this story as a purely auditory experience. According to Old Time Radio Catalog (otrcat.com) "The first broadcast reading ... came on December 22nd, 1922, on pioneer station WEAF New York. Many stations followed suit, and on Christmas Eve, 1928, the fledgling Columbia Broadcasting System broadcast a full-cast *Carol*." Almost 100 years later and we're still at it, like countless others around the world, every Christmas. Its staying power as a story to be heard and its continued relevance to modern society, cannot be denied.

We are fortunate to have a wonderfully talented cast for this show and an incredibly supportive crew. Once again, we are happy to have a collection of experienced and inexperienced performers, learning from each other. It has been a lot of fun working with such a dedicated group. I believe you will relish the diverse personalities our actors have created with their multiple voice characterizations. Any one of them would be a great choice to read to your children, who likely love readers who change their voice for each character. Indeed, some of our cast already fulfill this role from time to time!

I hope that you enjoy our interpretation of Philip Grecian's radio adaptation of this Christmas classic and that it leaves you feeling warm and hopeful. May your own heart laugh and may you, too, always know how to keep Christmas well.
