



Director's Note

"An autistic person falls down the rabbit hole the day they are born into the neurotypical world."

(www.kirstykendall.com/alice-in-wonderland-autism)

Alice's Adventures in Wonderland, by Lewis Carroll, was published in 1865. Some believe Carroll was autistic, long before autism was named. Today, 160 years later, now that the word exists, many autistics see Alice's story as the creative reflection of an autistic mind, while others recognize it as an outright allegory for autism. Check out kirstykendall.com or The Autistic Blogger (wordpress.com) for some interesting and provocative musings on this connection.

So, Leah McDonald and Peter Halley are not the only ones who saw the parallels between Wonderland and Autismland. They are, however, to my knowledge, the first to create a story and script based on the concept, with content largely coming from Leah's own experiences growing up in the autistic community.

I have learned a lot about autism in the process of bringing this play to the stage. More importantly, I have gotten to know some wonderful people in the autistic and neurodiverse community. They are active, creative, and hard-working. They are inspirational artists, athletes, and patient teachers to those of us in the neurotypical community who strive to understand the wonder-filled world of the autistic mind. I continue to learn.

Theatre CBS is delighted to be collaborating with Neurodynamic Theatrics to bring this play to its first school and first public audiences. May this be the beginning of a broader public educational initiative.

It has been my honour and privilege to direct these wonderful actors; child, youth and adult; neurodiverse and neurotypical alike. The creative journey has been enlightening and inspirational. I hope this play enhances your understanding of the neurodiverse world of autistic individuals, young and old. I hope even more that it contributes to a reduction (nay, elimination) of the incidences of bullying and mistreatment levelled against people in the autistic community; behaviour based on ignorance and misunderstanding.

Educate yourself. Be an advocate. Be a friend.
